General	The recent article in The Guardian has sent the Campus into a frenzy. This, combined with the lack of
updates	concrete announcement about the Scarborough support packages has meant a great number of students are now requesting refunds alone. Wrote a statement giving our stance on this, which has currently gone to five different media outlets.
	Helped student put together a motion asking HUU to back a lobby for refunds. This included getting students to put their thoughts down and presenting the information for Union Council.
	Have investigated where University contracts may have been breached. This has included a number of government related organisations.
	Students have been requesting to write formal complaints to the University. I have been in talks with staff at NUS into what routes and companies students can use to request refunds.
	Have spoken to Jeannette and Glenn regarding the contents of the support packages and Karen Thornton (Operations Manager) regarding the operations process. Certain components are ready to go if the sign off happens.
	Secured funding for band night on Campus. This will include a number of local bands playing in Calvino's, encouraging participation from the community.
	Have completed amendments to all Scarborough Exec Standing Orders.
	Attended staff meeting regarding employment. Currently, it is speculated that a number of Estates and Catering staff may be able to TUPE across to the Grimsby Institute.
