3. Campaigns Budget Discussion

PRES explained that this paper is to discuss change the campaigns budget in order to include Part Time Officer engagement as she was not aware that there was a budget for engagement. PRES said that it would be useful if the President Team could have access to this budget.

PS said that it would be useful to set out what engagement is if we are to access this. PS stated that there needs to be rules and criteria that would need to be met.

The Committee agreed in principle with the need to change the Campaigns Budget to the Campaigns and Engagement Budget. The Committee agreed that PRES would talk to CDC about drawing up criteria for the budget and bring it back to UEC for approval.

PID noted that her Part Time Officer's had been using the Inclusivity & Diversity budget for engagement. CEO said that it would be useful to have the information on the budgets fed into the induction for the President Team next year.

4. Update on Standing Orders

CDC explained that she had met with Stephen Dowson (SD) to discuss the Standing Orders and will be meeting with the Student Opportunities Manager to discuss amendments. CDC said that she would be putting together a document which will list all the changes to the Standing Orders.

PID asked if any changes to the Standing Orders would need to go to Union Council; PRES replied that they would need to go to Union Council unless the changes are made in line with the bye-laws.

PRES said that she will be meeting with RAG about their Standing Order and asked if we would need something written down about fundraising if we were to remove the Standing Order for RAG. PRES stated that she would be having an Activities Zone meeting which SD will attend to discuss any changes.

PID asked if there was an update on the Presidents Standing Orders; CEO replied that she has been chasing it, but that it is still sat with HR.

6. AGM

PRES explained that she and CEO have discussed changing the AGM going forward in order to encourage more students to attend. PRES noted that the suggestion was to have the AGM on a staff day and turn it into a celebration for all staff to attend, but have it open for all students to attend. PS suggested that we have the President Team presentation at this event too; the Committee agreed. CEO communicated that she took this to the SMT catch and SMT are happy to have it as part of the staff day; however, they had concerns that we would have it when student staff had left. PS suggested that we have it around the End of Year Ball.

The Committee agreed to have the AGM around summer staff away day in May.

7. Accountability Report - President of the Students' Union

PID asked if PRES had set up a meeting with Paul Bloomfield MP; PRES replied that a meeting had been set up and that it would be on 2nd March in Westminster.

PID asked if anything came out of the Climate Strike last week; PRES answered that she has not heard from the University about the strike. PE asked if the card had been delivered to the Vice-Chancellor; PRES replied that the Vice-Chancellor was not there on the day so it was not delivered to her.

PS noted that the strike was not posted clearly on the website as the environment section is hidden away. PS suggested that the environment page should be at the top under the join in section; PRES explained that the Junior Web Developer was redesigning the website, so the environment page will be moved eventually.


8. Accountability Report - President of Inclusivity & Diversity

PRES asked if PID would be doing a write up about the All Party Parliamentary Group she attended; PID replied that she would write it up this week.

PRES asked if there were any outcomes from the Accessibility Working Group; PID replied that there were two groups and that the University have recently merged them. PID explained that the Terms of Reference have just been confirmed and that the sub groups have been decided. PID said that there are no official outcomes yet. PID stated that she would be inviting two Part Time Officer's to future meetings.

9. Accountability Report - President of Sport

PID asked if there was a release date for the Varsity video; PS replied that it would not be released until nominations close.



PRES asked if PS had met with John Duffy (Chief Operating Officer) to discuss sport passes and the cost of sport; PS replied that she had and that he has requested that she write a report. PS explained that she is going to write a motion lobbying her position to write a report on the cost of sport so that it continues once she has left.

10. Accountability Report - President of Education

PID asked what SVOG was; PE replied that it was a meeting comprising of the Student Voice team, the Associate Dean's for Student Experience, and whoever is responsible for organising the SSFs. PE said that we discussed the issues about the representation system.

PID asked how PE is planning to get people to attend the PGR Forum; PE replied that he would ask Jackie McAndrew (Public Engagement and Post Graduate Researcher Experience Specialist) to contact PGR students and encourage them to attend.

Any Other Business

Athena SWAN Representation Request Form

PRES explained that the previous President of the Students' Union attended the Athena SWAN Steering Group last year. PRES expressed concerns about her suitability to attend the group.

CEO explained that the previous President of the Students' Union had oversight, but that it sat with the previous President of Inclusivity & Diversity mainly last year. CEO asked if Phil Quinn (Assistant Organisational Development Director) had spoken to PID about it; PID replied that it was mentioned at the Equality, Diversity, & Inclusivity Committee. PID expressed concerns that the Athena SWAN Steering Group seems very staff orientated, but that she is happy to attend. PS suggested that a staff member should also attend as well.

The Committee agreed that PID and Lisa Dearing (HR & Recruitment Co-Ordinator) attend the meetings.

ACTION AC to inform the University of the outcome of the form

Campaign Request Form – Improve Consent Training

PID explained that the Women's Representative is going to run an open meeting on what students would want the consent training to look like. PID said that this form is for funding for refreshments for the meeting. PID noted that the Women's Representative has asked for £60, but that we most likely will not spend that much.

PS expressed concerns that this was aimed mainly at supporting women and that consent training should support everyone.

PS expressed concerns that the motion was to lobby PID to do the training.

PRES expressed concerns that the form was not clear on what the Women's Representative wanted and that some of the money could go towards other things such as posters or sponsored posts.



ACTION PID to work with the Women's Representative and Marketing on the Campaign Request form and then send it via email for approval

PRES communicated that she and CEO have discussed changing HUU to HSU and asked if the Committee approved. CEO explained that we will do a natural change to the logo and that things will be replaced gradually.

PRES said that her plan would be to consult with students, contact the Trustees this week, and do a social media poll. PRES said that she would take it to Union Council for approval once all of this work had been completed.

CEO explained that it will fit in nicely with the new strategy and will differentiate us from the University. CEO said that most people get confused about what we are, as it is not made obvious that we are a students' union.

The Committee approved of PRES' plan.

CEO said that she had a look at the Breastfeeding Policy and it is irrelevant due to the fact that the building works are not going ahead. CEO communicated that CSD is going to look into finding a space. CEO suggested that we write the policy into other policies rather than having a dedicated policy for it.

ACTION CEO to discuss the location of a space with CSD

PS asked for feedback on the Varsity video; committee gave feedback.

PRES said that the Education Planning Committee is very time consuming, but that she and PE feel that they cannot contribute all the time. PE said that the meeting today was useful and that he contributed, but expressed concerns that he may not contribute at the next one. PRES will now stop attending the Education Planning Committee and PE shall attend on his own.

Dear Paul Blomfield MP,

We are writing to you in your capacity as Chair of the APPG on Students to request that a meeting is held to discuss the topic of student loans.

A key aim of the Group is to ensure that student views and experience are heard in Parliament and for parliamentarians to develop a greater understanding of important student issues. With the recent political U-turn on the nursing bursary, the 2019 election giving various political promises about student loans and the Augar review still in limbo, we believe that the topic of student loans needs to be debated in Parliament and that MPs and Peers should promote our interests.

We would like to include the following topics in the discussion:

- Loan instalment times/amounts
- Means-tested based on parents/partners income
- Impact on student mental health
- Impartiality of key services like UCAS
- Update on Augar Review outcomes and next steps
- Accommodation costs and value for money
- Affording child care and travel expenses
- Use of commercial loans and debt
- Nursing bursary back paying

Our current student finance system fails students across the UK, leaving many in financial hardship and student poverty. Student loans are meant to help individuals overcome financial barriers and access higher education, however, in their current state, they are not fit for purpose.

We look forward to hearing from you soon and meeting for the next APPG on Students Group.

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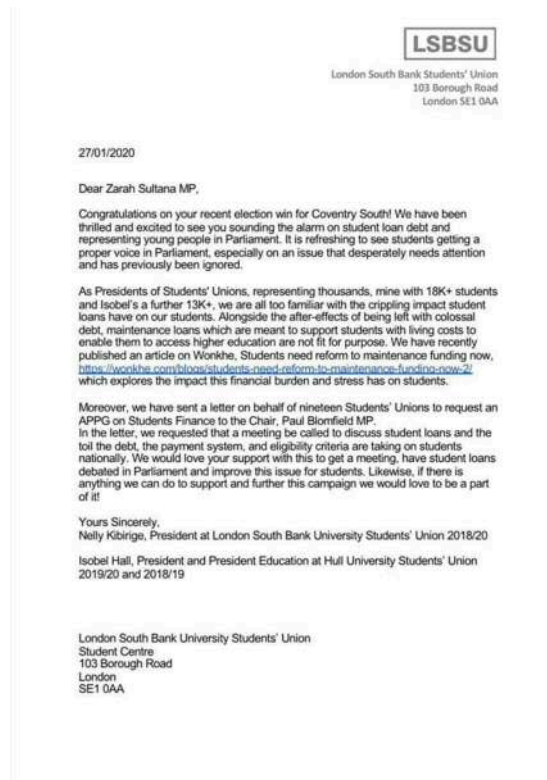
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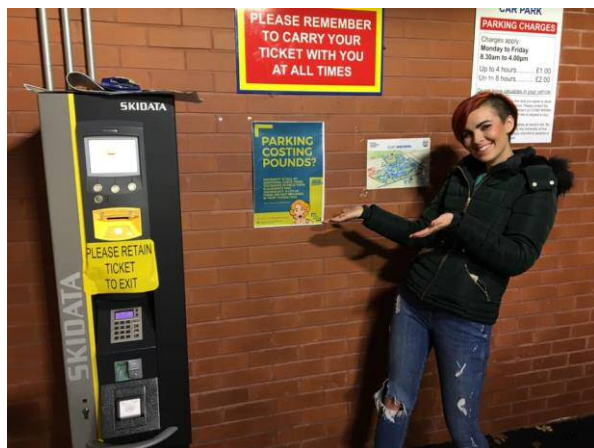
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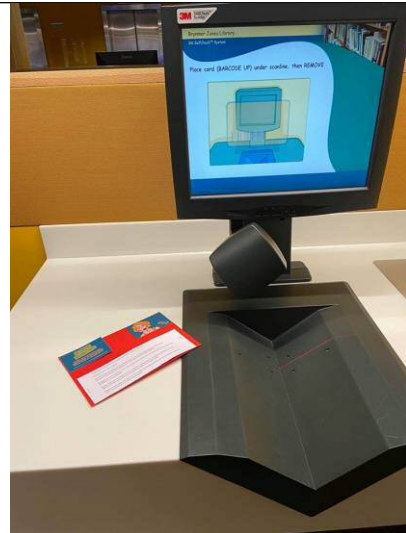
Co-wrote letter to Sarah Sultana MP with London South Bank SU President on student loans.

Actions:

- Attended an All Party Parliamentary Group on the Student Minds Mental Health Charter

Priority 2 Inclusivity
<p><u>Actions:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Attended autism awareness training alongside other HUU members of staff and Presidents to learn about ASD- Met with the Spectrum Society President in which she showed me the work she has been doing on creating a Passport for students with Autism to give to members of staff to help understand the adjustments they may require- Attended a working group in response to the EHRC report on racial harassment in HE with Ano (BAME rep) <p><u>Outcomes:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Used the training to try and adapt some of the things that we do as an organisation to make our events and communications more inclusive to everyone.- Looking at how we can get the passports University wide – Spectrum Society President is trialling with her lecturers before we look at how we can implement this. I have already had an initial conversation with Phil Quinn (University HR Director) who seemed to like the idea and it up for talking about where we could take this further.- An action plan has been put together in response to the EHRC report. This is a plan that assigns specific areas to people across the university that will be continuously reviewed by the group every 6 weeks <p><u>How I told students:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- The autism training was mentioned in my weekly update for that week – I got a lovely email from a student in response to this saying thank you for taking the effort to learn about autism

Priority 3 Accessibility
<p><u>Actions:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Distributed all sanitary products around the university for people to be able to access when needed- Attended the accessibility working group – a group with members from all across the University looking at how accessible we are and how we can improve in all aspects of University Life



Outcomes:

- Sanitary products were taken to BJL, Student Central, the Sports centre, the Pavilion and all four of the faculty hubs – this means that there will always be a supply close to where a student is making is accessible for all. We have made sure that the products aren't just in female toilets as well so those who do not use those toilets still have access to them.
- In the working group we split into sub groups to work on specific things – I have requested to be in the estates group so will be looking at how we can improve the estate e.g. ramps, lifts, hearing loops etc.

How I told students:

- Distribution of sanitary products was spoken about in a weekly update and in a post of its own. There are also posters informing students of the scheme at the sanitary product stations
- The working group has not been communicated yet but will be mentioned in my catch up video this week

We also had the chance to hear feedback and listen to any ideas students had, this could relate to anything and so was a great tool. At the end of the 2 week period, Tea and Toast had some regulars and so as a team we were pleased to see that we had positively impacted on some student's experience of the exam/assignment period. The team also reflected on Tea and Toast and we are looking forward to improving on the feedback we received for the summer assessment period. We are hoping better marketing and spreading out across campus will help us engage with even more students.• After contacting Steve Curtis I learned about the sport sessions they had over the exam periods. It was really important to share these with the AU clubs as a vast majority of them stop training and so miss out on their chance to unwind after a day in the library. I was sent marketing images and emails which were sent to AU

presidents to share within their clubs. I also liked and shared some of the relevant posts on Facebook to share the message.

- I worked with Gina and the Advice Centre to create an easy to understand guide on how to apply for extensions and mitigating circumstances. I thought this was really important as the process has changed in recent years and the stress of trying to learn a new process for a student would add unnecessary pressure in an already stressful time. Gina and I worked to create a 2 side document with print screens of the process. A blog post was also created.
- Worked with Hull Sport to ensure exam-stress related advice and support material was left in the sports hall – ready for when a student may leave an exam.

How I told students:

- Tea and Toast was shared on Facebook throughout the week via the Union's page as well as the Presidents' individual profiles.



- The available sports sessions were advertised in emails and via Facebook.
- The Mitigating Circumstances/Extensions 'how-to' guide was shared online via a blog post on the website. Hard copies were also printed and left at Tea and Toast as well as in the library and the Sports Hall.

Who it was with:

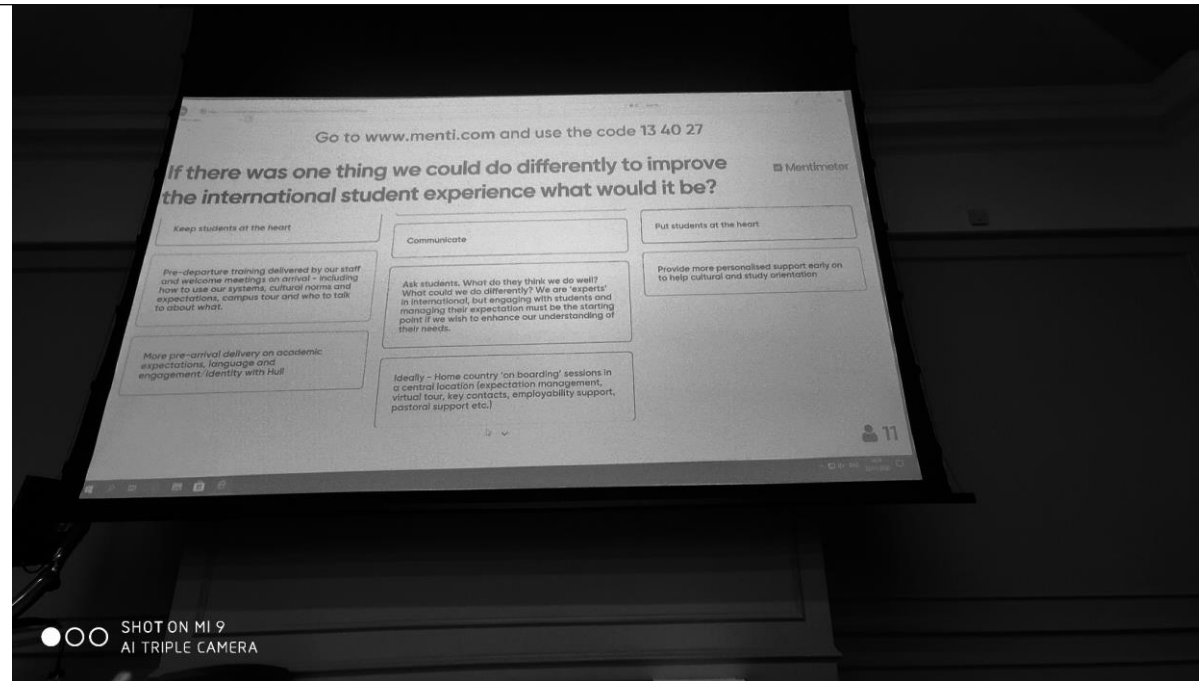
Isobel, Abi and I from the Union along with loads of staff from various sections of the University. The Away Day was hosted by Philip Gilmartin.
